School Board Report- October 15, 2015

Cole County R-1 Regular Board Meeting Newsletter Review

The Cole Co. R-1 School Board met in regular session on November 19th, 2015. The Board first heard reports from the administrators over each building. In unfinished business, an informational review of course offerings for the Nichols Career Center and the Eldon Career Center were discussed. Board policies were adopted or amended as presented during the October 15th board meeting. A proposal for the start of Football was presented at the October board meeting for discussion. It was determined that the Football youth committee would need to raise \$30,000 dollars before would become a school sponsored athletic program. Within this proposal, there are two option timelines. The start of football would be determined by the length of time need to raise the money. A motion was made and pasted to accept the proposal and giving the committee a goal to work towards. In new business. Superintendent Perry Gorrell presented an amended budget for the 2015-16 school year that outlines the schools budgetary needs for the school year. After a review of the items, the new budget was adopted. The board set board filing dates of December 15th- January 19th during normal business operating hours. Discussion was had on the possibility of installing new flooring in the Elementary Bathrooms. Plans were made to get bids to see about the cost to perform this project. A plan for conducting a community survey was presented by Mr. Gorrell and Debbie Malzner to start the strategic planning and CSIP planning for the district. This community survey will be distributed to the patrons of the district for completion and provide input. Technology director Cathy Trigg gave a review of the current technology in the district. She has been working with Morenet to do an assessment of our districts technology capabilities and to plan for future technology upgrades.


